Grand Challenges Frequently Asked Questions

ABOUT THE INITIATIVES

What are Grand Challenges?

The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation recognizes that solving the most pressing challenges in global health and development requires more of the world's brightest minds working on them. The Grand Challenges family of initiatives seeks to engage innovators from around the world to solve these challenges. Grand Challenges initiatives are united by their focus on fostering innovation, directing research to where it will have the most impact, and serving those most in need.

We are currently running two separate Grand Challenges Request for Proposals, each with specific requirements and individual timelines:

- <u>Accelerating Discovery for Non-Hormonal Contraceptives</u>
- Improving Access to and Use of Safe and Appropriate Cesarean Section

Are these grant opportunities part of Grand Challenges Explorations?

No, but these opportunities and Grand Challenges Explorations are part of the overall Grand Challenges family of grant initiatives. The application deadline for these RFPs is April 22, 2020, at 11:30 a.m. U.S. Pacific Time, after which time applications will no longer be accepted.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Can I speak to someone about my application?

Due to the high volume of inquiries, we are not able to provide individual guidance on ideas either before or after submission.

Applicants should decide if their ideas fit the specific criteria of either Grand Challenge by viewing their respective topic descriptions.

Are multiple submissions from an institution allowed?

Yes, any organization can submit multiple proposals as long as the content of each proposal is different, and each project is led by a different Primary Applicant. We discourage organizations from submitting the same application under different Primary Applicants.

Is there a specific format for the application?

Yes, please select the "Learn more" button at <u>https://grandchallenges.org/grant-opportunities.</u> Detailed instructions are available on the right-hand side of each topic. When ready, select "Apply Now" to submit an application.

Am I able to edit my proposal once submitted?

You may edit your proposal up until the deadline of April 22, 2020 at 11:30 am U.S. Pacific Time. After the application deadline, you cannot edit your document. Requests to update a proposal document will not be accepted.

If I am unable to identify a collaborator or sub-contractor, will the foundation help me identify such a group?

At this stage, the foundation is unable to facilitate collaborations for purposes of developing.

How do I submit my proposal?

All open grant programs are listed on the <u>Grand Challenges Website</u>. Navigate to the call you are interested in and click "Apply Now." Applications must be submitted through the application portal. E-mailed applications will not be accepted.

When is my application due?

Applications are due no later than **April 22, 2020, at 11:30 a.m. U.S. Pacific Time**. Late applications will not be accepted or considered.

Is it possible to have multiple applicants on a proposal?

Team collaborations are welcome within a single application. However, applicants need to elect a single Primary Applicant who will serve as the primary contact for the team. If awarded, the grant will be made to the Primary Applicant.

I am not presently employed by any organization. May I still apply?

In order to apply, you must be affiliated with an organization.

Am I eligible to apply if I work in the private sector?

Yes, we are accepting letters of inquiry from individuals at both private and public organizations.

What amount of indirect cost is available? Do you accept my U.S. organization's federally negotiated indirect cost rate?

SELECTION PROCESS

What feedback can I expect if my proposal is not selected?

Unfortunately, we are unable to provide feedback specific to the technical content of each proposal. However, we will communicate with applicants once a decision has been reached.
